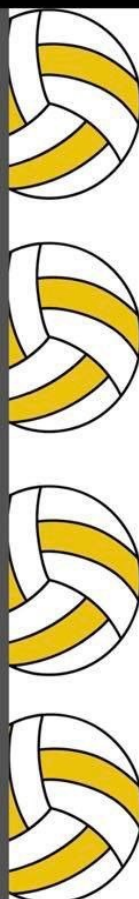

YOUR STORY MATTERS



Do you need some help to deal with an Australian Government department or an agency such as Centrelink, Child Support or Australia Post?

If you do, we're here to listen to your story. The staff at the **Commonwealth Ombudsman** will listen carefully to what you have to say, and we'll try to help you as soon as possible.

Make sure you contact the agency first to try and fix the problem. If you can't sort it out with them, please contact us.

You can reach us by phone on our dedicated Indigenous number **1800 060 789**, or tell us your story by lodging an online complaint at ombudsman.gov.au



It's a good idea to let us know that you are Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander so that we can make sure we give you the best possible support.

Our service is free, and we can provide interpreters if you need them. We don't take sides, and you don't need to tell us your name.

1. You contact us to tell us your story

2. We check if we can help you

3. If we think we can help we'll ask you and the agency for information to work out if what happened was right or fair, and if we can fix any problems we find. We don't take sides, and will listen to you and the agency.

If we can't help you, we'll find out who can.

4. We'll then tell you what we've decided and the reasons for our decision.

Or

We'll then tell you what we are able to do about the problem.
