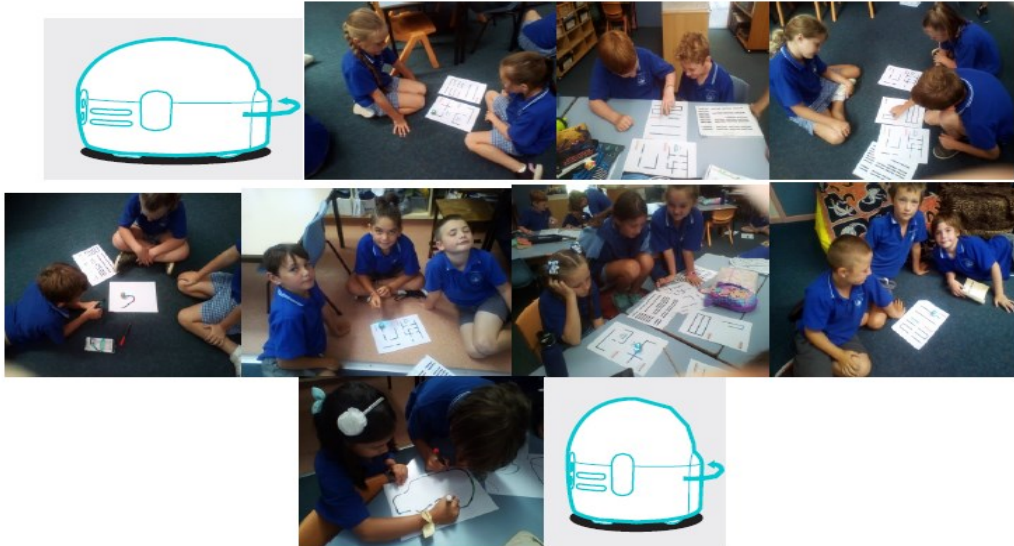

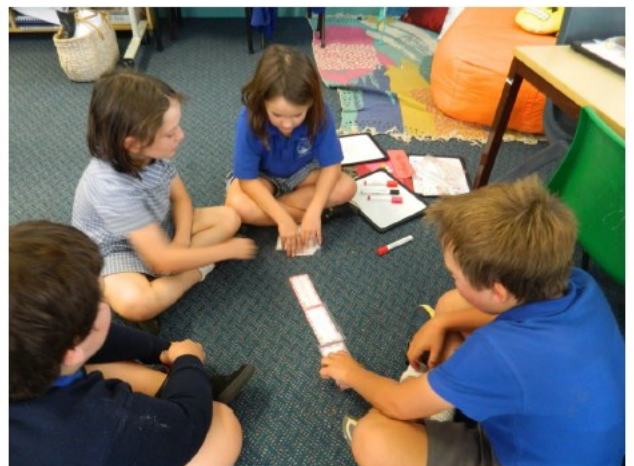
We have participated in a small taste of 21<sup>st</sup> century learning with enthusiasm.

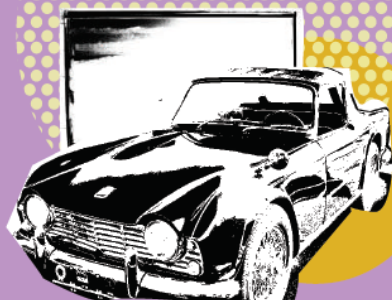
