# School travel for bushfire impacted students

## What to do if students living circumstances have changed

If living circumstances have changed, including a temporary change of residence, existing school travel pass holders should re-apply online by updating their details at - [apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updatedetails](https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updatedetails)

If unable to re-apply online, students can call us on 02 4474 4991 and we can assist. Once the update is approved, Marshalls will send a new school travel pass to the child's driver. This application should be completed by 24 February 2020. In the interim Marshalls will still allow students to travel free.

## What to do if the update is processed and students are no longer eligible

If students are no longer eligible but there are financial/family circumstances due to the recent bushfires, they can contact us and let us know and we will assist in getting in contact with Transport NSW to review each case for an exemption to allow them to travel for free.
