Phones & Device (smart watches etc)

The department of education has a strict policy on any digital device in schools which is rigorously reflected at Moruya PS:

"1.3 - Primary school students must not use digital devices during class, at recess and at lunch unless

approved by a principal or teacher. Exemptions may be granted by a principal or teacher, including allowing

students to use a device for an educational purpose, or as part of a <u>reasonable adjustment</u> for student learning and wellbeing."

All devices are strictly monitored by the school for everyone's safety and privacy. Any breach of a device use will result in confiscation and disciplinary procedures.

School/Class Helpers or Volunteers

Parents and community members are invited to be involved in the school within the classrooms as well as in the Canteen, Breakfast Club, Parent Group and many other areas. Class teachers usually invite parents/carers to assist in the classroom and at next week's Parent/ Teacher afternoon meeting there may be an opportunity for you to do so. One of the other areas help is needed includes the "Up & Running" reading program. This is where adults read one to one with students on a structured oral reading program. If you are interested, please contact Ms Herring. Unfortunately, there is the required paperwork for all volunteers across the school!

Uniform

It is important the students look a part of a school community as well as feel a part. Uniform is expected to be worn each day to school and if it is not, an explanatory note to the teacher from a parent is required. School hats in particular must be worn each day – either the bucket or broad brimmed. If students do not wear the school hat (not a cap) they will have to play under the covered area on the black top. The uniform shop is open for parents to purchase all their uniform needs.

At Moruya Public School PBL allows teachers and students to have more time to focus on relationships and classroom instruction.

Students and staff benefit from:

- Improved social-emotional wellbeing
- Positive and respectful relationships among students and staff
- Better support for teachers to teach, model and respond effectively to student needs
- A predictable learning environment where staff and students know what is expected to deliver effective practices that can be sustained over time

Students are acknowledged for positive behaviours with PBL tokens. All tokens are brought to assembly on Mondays and placed in the PBL barrel. Students names are drawn and prizes given. During term 1 PBL lessons are delivered to all classes and focusing on school expectations and positive behaviours.
